Exchange Studies at the Faculty of Pharmacy

Before application

Please read both the information on the pharmacy web and the following information before you do your application. Please note that you have to up-load some documents during the application. **The application must be submitted online no later than:**

- April 15 for the Academic Year or the Autumn Semester
- October 15 for the Spring Semester.

If you have a disability that demands special access to teaching premises, or special facilities in the teaching premises, please contact me in the beginning of April or October. Last days to book teaching premises for the following semester are 15 April (for autumn) or 15 October (for spring).

How to design a semester

During a semester, it is possible to study courses from all departments that are involved in the education of the pharmacy students. Most exchange students are offered a Basic Swedish Language Course of 7.5 ECTS twice a week on part time (25%) during the semesters, the levels offered are 1, 2 and 3 (application after arrival). There may also be a full time course on level 1 in August (application before arrival), please contact me if you are interested in following this.

You will find the faculty's theoretical courses held in English on the application forms. Normally you follow one course at a time, except for part time courses, with an exam at the end of the course. Please note that you can't follow two full-time courses during the same period. Depending on how long you will be enrolled at Uppsala University, you may be able to mix theoretical courses with a Degree Project. Here are some examples on how you can design your semester:

- a) theoretical courses up to 30 ECTS
- b) theoretical courses 15 ECTS or 7.5 + 7.5 ECTS, and a Degree Project 15 ECTS
- c) a Degree Project of 20 ECTS (3 month)
- d) a Degree Project of 20 ECTS and a theoretical course of 7.5 ECTS
- e) a Degree Project of 30 ECTS (one semester).

Examples:

- a) Applied Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Analysis 7.5 ECTS, Cell and Tumor Biology 7.5 ECTS, Molecular Imaging - with Focus on PET, 7.5 ECTS and Clinical Pharmacokinetics and Pharmacodynamics 7.5 ECTS
- b) Degree Project in Microbiology 15 ECTS and Advanced Organic Chemistry and Drug Synthesis 15 ECTS
- c) Degree Project in Pharmacy 20 ECTS (towards pharmaceuticals and biopharmaceuticals)
- d) Drug Discovery and Development 7.5 ECTS and Degree project in Pharmaceutical Chemistry 20 ECTS (towards physical pharmaceutical chemistry)
- e) Degree Project in Toxicology 30 ECTS.

You can combine most of the examples with a Basic Swedish course.

Departments and their research

During Degree Project Courses (thesis) at the end of their education, the Swedish students come in contact with advanced research for ten or twenty weeks (15 or 30 ECTS). Since these courses are individually planned, they may be done in English; please check the requirement of previous knowledge for the courses you are interested in.

The research at the Faculty of Pharmacy is categorized in three major fields; Drug Discovery, Drug Delivery, and Drug Usage. Pharmaceutical research and graduate education are closely interfaced with the pharmaceutical industry, the pharmacies, and other sectors of health and medical care. Please note that most laboratories are closed during the summer due to vacation.
